



Sand Hills Discovery Experience

The Sand Hills Discovery Foundation was chartered in 2001 for the purpose of providing comprehensive information about the Sand Hills area. Building on the legacy of the late, world famous paleontologist, Morris F. Skinner and his wife Marie, the Foundation hosts the annual Sandhills Discovery Experience. The event embraces a new theme each year, and includes two days of tours, sandwiched around a day of seminars. If they desire, attendees can sign up for college credit through Wayne State College.

A core group of about 10 volunteers work to put on the conference, which requires a year of planning. Of course, many more volunteers are involved during the 3 days of the conference.
