PURPOSE

build a constituency among communities, businesses, individuals, universities, tribes, the Forest Service, and other groups in the stewardship of the natural and cultural resources across the Selway-Bitterroot Wilderness. Projects typically accomplished by the foundation include campsite restoration and trail rehabilitation projects.

Beginning in 2005, the Bitter Root Resource Conservation & Development (RC&D) Area, Inc. provided its nonprofit status umbrella and financial oversight to the foundation on an annual basis, as well as providing in-kind donations to the project of over \$4,600. On September 23, 2010 the SBF received notification they were granted their own 501(c)(3) tax-exempt status from the IRS. Concerning Bitter Root RC&D's assistance over the years, the SBF recently noted:
