This year's presenters were: Audrey Barnhardt of Williston State College and North Dakota Park Service, Dr. Chris Beachy of Minot State College, Mark Crosby, NRCS District Conservationist of Bowbells, Sarah Tunge of North Dakota Forest Service in Bottineau, Heather Duchscherer of the ND Health Dept. and Kristin Brennan NRCS-Soil Survey Leader.

The students traveled to six stations to learn about frogs, salamanders, wetlands, range and pastureland, water quality-macro's, forestry, soils, and snakes.
