The Ola Ladies Club, in conjunction with the Ola Community Board of Directors, and in partnership with the West Central Highlands RC&D and the Idaho Community Foundation, has worked toward restoration of the Community Hall since 1994. The Hall is now complete. The Church Building is still a work in progress and is expected to take several more years. In a town that has only about ten buildings, these two buildings are worth their weight in gold and represent the center piece of community spirit in the Ola area.
